



INTERVIEW QUESTIONS

- Prepare ten good questions to ask your subject.
- Practice your questions so you don't have to read them.
- Keep your questions relevant and interesting.
- Film the questions in a combination of "close-up", "wide", and "dirty two" shots. Make sure you film your questions too.
- Listen to their responses, and ask follow up questions. Don't repeat questions if they have already answered.

WHAT'S A GOOD QUESTION?



Are you a policeman?



Can you tell me a bit about your job?

Good questions encourage people to speak in their own words. Ask "open" questions so that people can say more.



How long have you been a policeman, and why did you decide to become one?

Avoid asking two questions at once. One at a time please!



Why do you think being a policeman is hard?



How do you find being a policeman?

Good questions don't tell people how they feel. They ask!
